The college has been functioning at Government Senior Secondary School Barotiwala for almost 7 years. The new campus building was inaugurated in September 2022 by the then Hon'ble Chief Minister Shri Jai Ram Thakur in Buranwala, Barotiwala. The classes became functional from April 2023 at the new building after the inauguration of classes by Hon'ble CPS Sh. Ram Kumar Chaudhary. The campus area of the college is 2.72 hectares.

Presently, the college provides education in Arts and Commerce streams with the help of well-qualified, experienced and committed teaching staff. The programmes are being run in accordance with H.P. University, Shimla guidelines and directions of the state Government.

- 8. No designated position for a sports teacher.

- 2. Providing hands-on computer training for all students.
- 3. Hosting national and international seminars and conferences.
- 4. Strengthening the college-industry-community network.
- 5. Establishing MOUs with industries to offer students internships, training programs, scholarships, and other opportunities.

Institutional Challenges:

- 1. The inadequate educational background of students from rural areas poses a significant barrier to their full academic potential, making it challenging for the college to deliver quality education with limited resources.
- 2. The college must enhance its Old Students Association (OSA) to secure increased funding in the future.
- 3. The campus faces significant challenges in development and beautification due to the absence of proper boundary walls, especially with the surrounding industrial landscape.
- 4. As a small institution, the college struggles with insufficient funding, which complicates efforts to improve and develop the campus.
- 5. There is potential to introduce new courses such as Science streams, BBA, BSA, and Tourism and Travel, among others.
- 6. The institution must address these challenges and integrate them into the design and implementation of best practices.
- 7. Air pollution from nearby factories poses a serious health risk to students.

1. Mode of Teaching at Government Degree College Barotiwala

1.1 Blended Teaching

Majority of the teaching work in government College Barotiwala is done in physical classrooms but a useful blend of teaching, work is created by the teachers through the use of various ICT tools such as creating WhatsApp groups of classes on which the links of the audio and video content are shared by the teachers. Teachers pick up the best lectures on the topics in the course from universities of international standard and share it with their students on these WhatsApp groups, feedback or which is taken from the students in the physical classrooms. Online group discussions and Department seminars are sometimes conducted through the apps or on digital mode. Teachers also engage students through the YouTube lectures in the smart classrooms on as per the requirement of the respective course syllabus and learner needs.

1.2. Curriculum Planning and Implementation

Himachal Pradesh University, to which our college is affiliated, brings out its academic calendar before the onset of every session. We at our institutional level adapt our activities -academic and other extension activities accordingly so that students get sufficient opportunity to enhance their talents and assets. The calendar comprises a balanced routine of teaching days, extra co-curricular, sports championships, etc. in synchronization with the Mid-term tests as well as the Term-end examinations. The IQAC of our college plans a calendar following the University Academic calendar and at the same time taking into account the institutional exigencies such as the local climate and working conditions, etc. our dedicated teaching and non-teaching staff meticulously follow the calendar which is widely publicized through the college Website, Prospectus, Notice boards and other digital platforms such as the college website, Facebook page and Whatsapp, etc. Teachers plan their respective Teaching Schedules of all the Courses keeping in mind the Annual calendar and the college proudly claims that all teachers are able to follow their teaching schedules.

1.2.4 Internal Assessment mechanism followed by all departments

We at our college ensure a complete and continuous internal assessment of the performance of our students through organized and planned working of the two committees of our institution – Time-table Committee and Examination cell. The advisory board of the college supervises the working of these bodies of the college. As per the pre-defined requirement of the internal assessment system adopted by the H.P. University, to which our college is affiliated, ,30 marks out of 100 marks allocated to each course being taught in the college are divided into three different yet inter-connected components. 5 marks weightage out of the 30 marks are earned by a student for their attendance throughout the session, 10 marks for the class assignments and 15 marks for the house tests. At least 1 mark obtained for attending at least 75% classes in each in the component of attendance qualifies a student to sit for the house test and a strict discipline is observed in the classes for this under the scrutiny of the time-table committee and later through the records of the examination cell. Complete transparency is maintained through regular notices being displayed on the college notice boards and are shared digitally with the students through WhatsApp groups.

1.2.5 Prompt communication of assessment/results to students

The college has been able to maintain a reputation of discipline and deep integrity in its work culture. In keeping with the continued spirit of punctuality, the teachers complete the task of evaluation of answer scripts of the House Examination and preparation of the Internal Assessment awards within a week's time and students are notified through the notice boards and through h WhatsApp groups to meet the concerned teachers for reviewing their assessment. Sufficient time is given to students to get any errors of assessment and evaluation corrected or rectified.
