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Summary of Faculty Feedback Survey

The faculty feedback survey gathered responses from 10 teachers representing diverse departments — Higher Education, Commerce, Hindi, English, Music (Instrumental), Geography, and History. The participants included an equal number of Assistant Professors and Associate Professors, with most having over 5 years of teaching experience, reflecting mature and experienced perspectives.

Teaching & Academic Environment

Overall, the curriculum and syllabus were rated as Good to Excellent, indicating satisfaction with academic content. Timetable management was widely considered Very Effective. However, academic freedom received mixed responses — while some faculty members expressed satisfaction, others felt only partially free in academic decision-making. Access to teaching-learning resources such as ICT tools, library, and laboratories varied significantly, suggesting disparities in departmental resource availability.

Infrastructure & Institutional Support

Faculty members praised the classrooms and general infrastructure, rating them mostly Excellent. However, internet and digital facilities emerged as a key concern, with several teachers marking them as Poor. Administrative transparency, cleanliness, and approachability of administration received strong positive feedback, generally rated Good to Excellent. Institutional efforts toward overall development were also appreciated, though with some scope for improvement.

Professional Development & Work Environment

Most faculty reported consistent encouragement to participate in Faculty Development Programmes (FDPs) and workshops, showing institutional commitment to continuous learning. A majority felt respected and valued in their roles. Teachers strongly agreed that they were encouraged to invite experts and organize lectures, reflecting a collaborative academic culture. Opinions on ICT facilities were mixed, and the grievance redressal system was generally viewed positively.

Challenges Identified

Key challenges included:

- Excessive non-teaching and documentation work.
- High workload, particularly in single-teacher departments.
- Inadequate internet connectivity and digital infrastructure.

Difficulty in balancing teaching, research, and administrative duties



Action Taken

To lessen the burden of excessive non-teaching and documentation work, several standardized performs were prepared and introduced for routine administrative processes such as sanction or permission requests, calls for quotations, comparative statements, and supply orders. This initiative helped in streamlining official procedures, reducing repetitive paperwork, and ensuring uniformity and accuracy in documentation across departments. Requirement for more staff specially in single teacher department was sent to Department of Higher Education Himachal Pradesh. Computer facilities in IQAC room, examination room, in staff room with printer and ITC lab with more than 20 computers with internet facilities has been established.

- **80–85%** satisfaction with infrastructure, safety, and campus environment—indicating a **secure and supportive learning atmosphere**.

- **Sports facilities** received lower ratings (about 25% suggested improvement), indicating a need for **greater investment and participation encouragement**.

Key Challenges Identified

1. **Inconsistent communication and feedback mechanisms** with parents.
2. **Limited sports infrastructure** and physical activity promotion.
3. **Need for modernization and maintenance** of facilities.
4. **Insufficiently structured internship and placement framework**.
5. **Need for skill-oriented and employability-focused curriculum**.
6. **Scope for enhanced community engagement and student welfare initiatives**.

Action Taken

To address the key challenges identified through parental feedback, the college would implement a series of targeted actions aimed at strengthening communication, enhancing infrastructure, and promoting holistic student development. First, to overcome inconsistencies in communication and feedback mechanisms, the institution have establish a regular schedule for Parent-Teacher Association Meetings (PTAs) and introduce digital platforms such as mobile apps, online college website, or WhatsApp groups and e- newsletter etc to provide real-time updates on student performance and college activities. A feedback from stakeholders or parents on google sheet will be taken with more stakeholders' participation and coordination to ensure that parents remain informed and engaged.



In response to concerns about limited sports infrastructure, college would sent requirement for the post of Physical teacher to Deptt. of higher education. The college would prioritize upgrading existing facilities, introducing inter-departmental sports events, and organizing an annual sports meet and setting badminton and volleyball court, purchase of sports equipment's etc to encourage wider student participation. A college volleyball team represented college in Volleyball championship held at Hamirpur this year. Partnerships with local sports academies/senior secondary school and inclusion of fitness activities such as celebration of yoga day etc part of the academic calendar would further promote physical well-being and a healthy campus culture.

To address the need for modernization and maintenance of facilities, the college conduct annual infrastructure/ stock verification for maintenance. Upgrading ICT tools, improving hygiene standards, and modernizing classrooms and laboratories will create a more conducive learning environment. Regular cleaning and maintenance schedules should also be institutionalized to ensure a safe and comfortable campus experience.

Strengthening the internship and placement framework is another crucial area. The establishment of a dedicated Career counselling and Placement Cell (CCPC) can facilitate stronger industry linkages, structured internship programs, and better employability outcomes. College has signed MOU's with Vrindavan Ayurveda Chikitsalam, Baddi, Agrestal Organic Pvt.ltd, Nirmal Spinning Mills, Baddi etc. in 2024-2025 and number of industries such a Prime Steel Industries, Park Pharmaceuticals.Alive, Health CareNational Laboratories, Biomagic Enterprise were visited for wider exposure for the students. These type of initiatives would be taken in coming time for the larger benefits of the students.

Organizing career fairs, experts talks talks, and skill-development workshops and mock interviews will be held to help students to prepare for the job market, while soft-skill and career counselling sessions can be integrated into the curriculum to enhance readiness. In terms of academics, the introduction of skill-oriented and employability- Trainee Programme were organized and will continues with larger coverage area. Finally, to promote community engagement and student welfare, the college launched outreach initiatives such cleanliness drive by NDSS and campus beautification and ECO club, Nuked Natak by Red Ribbion Club, rallies by different clubs on drug addition, road safety, Har Ghar Tiranga etc and an eye check up camp was organized by NSS in ward no 3. Of Panchyat Barotiwala. More such programes and community outreach programmes would be included in next year activities calander of NSS and other clubs of the college. Strengthening counseling and mentoring systems, along with organizing workshops on inclusivity, discipline, and gender sensitivity, will further enhance student support and campus harmony. Overall, these actions aim to create a more communicative, modern, and inclusive academic ecosystem—one that fosters parental trust, supports student growth, and reinforces the college's commitment to continuous improvement and excellence.
